# **CEO's report**

This has been a significant year for Croydon Drop In, where the charity has continued to grow and help more children, young people and their families. This has been against a backdrop of change, a growing demand for our services and increasing complexity and risk. My predecessor, Gordon Knott, was instrumental in forging a path to the growth of the charity, both financially and in the number of people that we support and make a difference to every day.

Croydon Drop In has grown substantially since the pandemic, and we are a trusted partner and provider within the mental health system. Our work supports the health transformation agenda and we have built a strong partnership with the South West London Integrated Care System.

Children, young people and families continue to face challenges in their lives which impact on their emotional health and wellbeing, exacerbated by an ongoing cost-of-living crisis, and a shortfall in funding and resources across systems to meet their needs. This year saw a change in government; we are still in its infancy and await to hear more details about their decisions and plans moving forward, though it has clearly laid out that the NHS, and mental health support, will be a specific focus area.

During 24/25, my focus will be on strengthening Croydon Drop In to meet future challenges, including upgrades to our digital systems and infrastructure, ensuring robust governance and efficient processes are in place, and creating the capacity and conditions to support our continued growth.
